

- Wearing suitable protective gear (e.g. work gloves, safety goggles) and performing tasks with a second person is recommended.
- $\rightarrow$ Select a suitable place and firm base (stable foundation) to assemble the artwork. Due to its design, in general, the stability of the artwork is only afforded to a limited extent in case of vibration (e.g. jolting, pulling) and tensile loading (e.g. wind). If necessary, additionally secure the artwork to the wall and floor with suitable materials. Always keep children and animals away from the artwork. Regularly check the stability of the artwork and condition of the connections (cable ties).




3.2 Step 1

Standing version
First, all four pipes need to be cut to a length of 4.50 metres using the metal saw. Mark where you are going to cut with masking tape. Firmly secure the pipes before cutting them to length, for example using a squared timber and one-handed clamps. This will make it easier to make a straight cut. Tip: You can put the pipes on the folding trestles.





Standing version
Sand both edges of the cut surface with sandpaper to remove splinters. If your pipes were delivered with yellow caps, you can use them as additional protection at the end of the pipe.



The easiest way to connect the pipes is to lay them on the floor.






3.2 Step 4

Standing version
Use two cable ties for each join and cross them over one another to ensure a stable hold (see photo). Make sure that the distance between the top ends of the pipes is the same as those shown in the diagram. Tip: mark out the distances on the floor using masking tape. Tie each join in the order shown by the numbers in the photo.

Open all the jackets and lay them out on the ground.

The hoods must be unfolded.




Join all six jackets together by zipping each jacket to another jacket.






Don't create a ring of jackets by zipping the final jacket to the first one.

Lift up the pipe structure and hang jackets two, three, four and five on the pipes by the hood.

The other two jackets should hang down to the right and left. They are then turned over and can now be connected on the pipes by zipping them to one another.

With the help of another person, you can now lean the structure against a wall or another sturdy object.

Make sure that all four pipes are standing firmly and cannot slip.



When hanging, the jackets are 1.85 metres long. In order to make sure there is enough space between the floor and the jackets, the lowest hook should be placed at a height of at least 2 metres.

Drill the holes into the wall. Blow the dust out of the holes and insert the wall plug.






